Seeking after wisdom – understanding knowledge Proverbs 3:13-14

 ¹³ Blessed are those who find wisdom, those who gain understanding,
 ¹⁴ for she is more profitable than silver and yields better returns than gold.

What type of wisdom? Proverbs 3:19-20

 ¹⁹ By wisdom the LORD laid the earth's foundations, by understanding he set the heavens in place;
 ²⁰ by his knowledge the watery depths were divided, and the clouds let drop the dew.

Solomon's words from Wisdom of Solomon 7 (Apocrypha)

¹⁵ May God grant me to speak with judgment, and to have thoughts worthy of what I have received; for he is the guide even of wisdom and the corrector of the wise.
¹⁶ For both we and our words are in his hand, as are all understanding and skill in crafts.
¹⁷ For it is he who gave me unerring knowledge of what exists, to know the structure of the world and the activity of the elements;
¹⁸ the beginning and end and middle of times, the alternations of the solstices and the changes of the seasons,
¹⁹ the cycles of the year and the constellations of the stars,
²⁰ the natures of animals and the tempers of wild animals, the powers of spirits^[a] and the thoughts of human beings, the varieties of plants and the virtues of roots;
²¹ I learned both what is secret and what is manifest,
²² for wisdom, the fashioner of all things, taught me.

Isn't Christianity just a silly old myth that's been disproved by scientists?

• Richard Dawkins, British biologist and prominent atheist:

"Faith is the great cop-out, the great excuse to evade the need to think and evaluate evidence. Faith is belief in spite of, even perhaps because of, the lack of evidence."

• My mother:

"Surely you can't believe all that nonsense about Jonah and the whale, and things like that?"

- Faith deals mostly with things that cannot be scientifically proven
- Science defines everything, so since faith can never be proven, it must be false.

QED?

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Faith and science

Faith

- Faith covers the observable and non-observable.
- Can't be tested using scientific methods

"Science without religion is lame; religion without science is blind." Albert Einstein

Science

- Science simply deals with the observable world.
- Makes predictions, testable



How Christianity came to Saxon England



- In 627 AD Edwin, high king of all England, called a council of elders at Yeavering, near Ad Gefrin, to consider the adoption of Christianity.
- His chief priest, Coifi, denounced his pagan beliefs: "I verily declare to you that the religion which we have hitherto professed has, as afar as I can learn, no virtue in it." He went on to profane his own altars.
- However, the winning argument came from one of his elders:

The story of the sparrow

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• The present life of man, O king, seems to me, in comparison of that time which is unknown to us, like to the swift flight of a sparrow through the room wherein you sit at supper in winter, with your commanders and ministers, and a good fire in the midst, whilst the storms of rain and snow prevail abroad; the sparrow, I say, flying in at one door, and immediately out at another, whilst he is within, is safe from the wintry storm; but after a short space of fair weather, he immediately vanishes out of your sight, into the dark winter from which he had emerged. So this life of man appears for a short space, but of what went before, or what is to follow, we are utterly ignorant. If, therefore, this new doctrine contains something more certain, it seems justly to deserve to be followed.

• (Bede, Book II, chapter 13)





Christ's disciple, Peter, also saw this:

- ⁶⁶ From this time many of his disciples turned back and no longer followed him.
- ⁶⁷ "You do not want to leave too, do you?" Jesus asked the Twelve.
- ⁶⁸ Simon Peter answered him, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. ⁶⁹ We have come to believe and to know that you are the Holy One of God."

John 6:66-69

Why Jesus?

- Historical evidence for the existence of Christ is very strong (*though we can never "prove" Christianity!*).
- If Christ never existed, where did Christianity come from? Why were so many early Christians willing to die for their faith?

For me, the person of Jesus – an incarnation of God on Earth, on Earth to live a perfect life and to save humankind – is a challenge I must face. I can't try to hide behind "scientism".
